There are two types of child, according to my pediatrician friend Archie, and they are "your own and everybody else's". So, with

that in mind let me tell you about the discovery my daughter made. Phoebe is twenty months old and has been taken by her mum and dad to a lot of football already. However, I had not noticed the gender bias that I may just have been unwittingly putting into place. Whilst going through the first two Stop Out programmes of the season Phoebe discovered that women also play football. If it has pictures then Phoebe generally has her nose in it but this time we heard her saying "girls... girls". My partner Kylie then told her that girls play football the same way that boys do. It was here that Kylie and I realised that Phoebe's little blank look had an element of disbelief about it. After all, I guess, in all of the matches she has been to, about fifteen so far, not once has any woman appeared on the pitch.

As I started thinking about it, not introducing Phoebe to women's football. I made a few excuses to myself. After all I saw my first women's match back in the seventies. Then I watched my sister, Susan, play on to get two Kelly Cup Final medals and three championship medals. I coached, briefly a women's team... and I have spent, of late, about three seasons watching another club's first team in the Women's Central League. (Tangent: This, I understand, made Chris Canton despair.) I can even say I saw Maia Jackman's out of this world header in that final at Newtown Park. However, it was a comment on Facebook that made me think a little more. I wrote, of the season starting that weekend 'all set for Saturday?' and the reply read '....and Sunday'. Despite all of the above I had completely overlooked that the weekend marked the start of the football season for both men and women. Why was that the case? I tried again to defend it by thinking that I tend to focus on two teams regardless of gender and they are Stop Out and Wellington Phoenix but therein lies the argument. The term, Stop Out, as I use it means just the men's first team and is not a catch all for teams that represent this club.

In conversation with a particular club stalwart I know that he often says "which team" when I say to him that I went to watch Stop Out play. To this I sometimes hesitate and as myself why he does not realise what I mean. With more thinking I believe that he has the healthier attitude. He sees the club as a set of teams that cover different playing levels and different

genders. It is just the way it is. So, my lesson is learned and this Sunday Phoebe, and I, will be on the sideline watching Stop Out in another of its forms.
