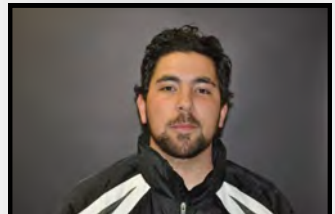

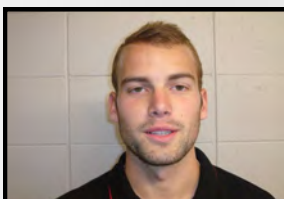

All the best with your recovery Luke and we look forward to your return to the Red and Golds in 2013.

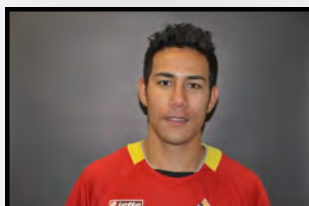

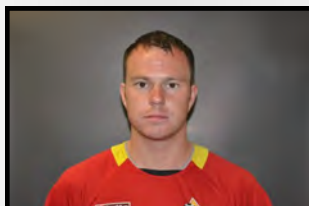

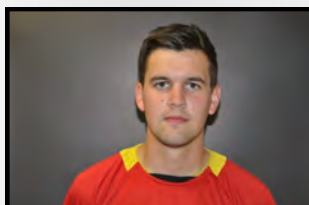

Iferouane is a small town in the Sahara. More accurately it is the Air Mountains in Niger. I remember it well. It is remote and is difficult, but not overly so, to reach. During the rebel uprising in 2008 the entire town was emptied as the population fled both army and rebel harassment. When there is peace, as there was when my friends and I visited, it is clear it is a really pleasant place to live. It gets rain because of its altitude. Not much rain but enough to produce great fruit and vegetables. The pomegranates were the best I have ever tried. I scored a goal there. I was pleased.

A few weeks ago my friend scored a goal. He doesn't score many. He had scored a goal whilst playing indoor football in, a place far more familiar, Lower Hutt. He was pleased. He doesn't score many but it meant something to him. We talked about what it meant to score our goals. We were clear that it just gives you that bit of a lift. Then we talked for some time about what it means to play. He admitted to me that he had felt just the slightest bit nervous going on to the indoor pitch. We chuckled about the idea of him being nervous. Then I thought back to Iferouane and remembered feeling the same when the local youth had invited me on to their pitch. That nervous feeling could mean a couple of things but I think it means that you care about what it is you are trying to do. You simply want to enjoy yourself, look like you know what you are doing, and give of your best. Be that at the level of indoor football or a square of sand between some trees in a dusty village. All the way up to the top tables of football.

So the 2012 season starts, in earnest, and I confess to feeling that nervousness. Not nervous for me, as I no longer play, but for all of those at Stop Out, on and off the field, and the teams we play this season. Some of you, who play, have been out there training hard for a while now. Hoping that when the season starts you will impress your coach, your team mates, your friends, and, most of all, yourself. After all you can fool others but we all know that we cannot fool ourselves. To all of you who are playing let us hope you have the very best of seasons.

Those of us who are not playing but perfecting the noble art of 'spectating', well, we have much to do as well. We will be supporters and, as is often the way, we will be the critics. For, as well all know, the game is easy from the sideline. Criticism should be, must be, constructive. So, no matter which side of that white line you are on the 2012 season starts here. Enjoy it!
