



The First Word


My blood is red... and gold!

Syria. Yes even though he's been playing senior first team football for 4 year he is still only 17 years old.

Born on 19th September 1997 Cherbel debuted for the first team on the 13th May 2012 at 14 years and 6 days. He played in the 3-1 win Chatham Cup victory against Western Suburbs. And even further detail - he came on for Fisum.

But Cherbel must leave the club that has helped his development through to senior ranks and he will play for Wellington United in the Capital Premier League. So the opportunity to play Central League is lost for at least one more year.

There is much discussion in local football circles as to the merit of this move with the Phoenix having carte blanche control over Wellington United's first team and the exclusive use of Phoenix Academy players in the team. Time will tell if it is of benefit to all in football.



At least Cherbel will have some Stop Out linkage with Justin Raffan maintaining his long term involvement with coach Andy Hedge and the Phoenix, being confirmed as team Manager at Wellington United in 2015.

Cherbel leaves the club after making 54 first team appearances and scoring 7 goals. But at least there will be a Khouchaba flying the Stop out flag younger brother Ramsin playing in our 11th grade travel league team. All the best Cherbel and I'm sure you'll be back in the red and gold of Stop Out in the future.








Welcome from Chris Sambrooke

Women's update

It's been the craziest summer and preseason in local women's football any of us can recall.

It started predictably enough, the club entering for the third summer an U₁₇ team in the growing CF U₁₇ League, and we used this to build for our hosting for the first time an U₂₀ Tournament for club teams at the end of November. With two clubs down from Auckland we had a great weekend at Hutt Park. Our team upset the bookies at the TAB with a stunning performance as underdogs in the semis (beating Papatoetoe on penalties). The Final was a cracker which we lost o-1 to Waterside Karori.



2015 started with the appointment of Michael Gibbs as our new Director of Women's Football and the usual rusty and dusty first trainings on hot evenings. As usual there were a few new faces taking a look as well as a few "old" friends and the back for another year crew. Along with this we were preparing our U17's for their third run up to the Auckland City Youth Tournament, the planning of which is a bit of a major military exercise behind the scenes.

Maybe it was the summer heat or something in the water because then it all went a little crazy. First up we heard of Waterside Karori pulling out of Women's Central League – incredible, a team that had won the title in recent years and finished 3rd in 2014. Motoroa (from New Plymouth) took the vacant place due to their 2014 finish.

Then whispers became fact, a few days later Lower Hutt City pulled their team from WCL (and also folded their Premier League team). The door opened for another club to enter the 2015 Central League and yes, courtesy of our 2014 finish we were offered a place. Of course we leapt at that.

Within days we also were able to put our reserves into the Premier League! Sterling work from Craig Darby (Women's Football Manager) with the Capital Football offices, many calls and emails over two weeks and the cherry on top was being able to then move our third team into Division One.

So trainings had their intensity lifted as preparations roared into life so that we are well placed to field competitive teams in CL and PL. Elevation to the top of the regions leagues may not have happened by the usual channels but is just reward for the hard work of many people year in, year out since women's football was given our focus at the start of 2008. It's come a long way from opening day of that year, and while there's a few new faces about the club it's pleasing to note that from the '08 Originals Alana Marsh will be part of our first ever CL squad, as will Sophie Burley who came along part way through 2008.

The CL team starts the campaign off with a trip to last year's runners-up, Seatoun and if that's not tough enough the first home game is hosting champions, Massey University on April 12th.

The Premier team is at Petone first up, under the guidance of new coach, Phil Dobbin. It's great to have Phil on board; he's looking forward to the job of running a reserves team in a challenging league but loves the environment we've developed here at Stop Out, the biggest women's club in the region. Our Development team will be coached by Terry Ross, playing in D1, while club stalwart, Angus Williamson, is once again the very brave bloke who guides the "Blacks" each match day in D2. Life-long Stop Out fan Mike Barton gives us his personal view on the beautiful game!



This was in the 1978 season by beating, the now defunct, Hungaria three goals to one. As you may know the 2015 final had a great link to the 1978. In that, Barry Pickering who played in the 1978 match had his son, Sam, playing in last weekend's game. It strikes me that Wellington football is lucky to have this tournament around. For those that are not aware it was first played for in 1955. Stop Out have contested six finals and ran out winners five times.

The difficulty is that so much of the older tournaments is just down to memory. Perhaps someone can help me here? My favourite, I often believe, was the 1974 victory over Wellington City. It was played at the Basin Reserve on a very wet and grey Wellington day. There was a small group of us all sat together in the older stand. Being honest I think we were all huddling together for warmth. It was quite atmospheric in its own way. That is how it is fixed in my memory. Every now and again I have a mental picture of Stop Out beating Wellington City but in sunshine at Newtown Park. It cannot have been both, obviously, but I start to wonder if this is the price you pay for having so much 'football stuff' stored in memory.

Another Hilton Petone memory is the idea of intensity. At one time my father would come to the games with me, probably grudgingly. We had watched a few one season, probably 1971(ish) and Stop Out had been a bit dire. My father had probably seen enough when I asked him to take me to Newtown Park for a game against Wellington City. He was of the mind, and maybe I was as well, that we would be bored and Stop Out would get beaten. It was interesting, and serendipitous, in that there was major step up in intensity and the game was very competitive. This was probably the first time I had ever thought about things like motivation. All the way home I kept asking why it was so much better. My father answered, around the lines of, that the players wanted to make a statement, prove a point, show the other side they were superior. It was probably something of all of that contributed to that extra energy and grit.

Today, in our opening Men's Central League 2015 match, I am certain that we will see that extra intensity and drive to win. Both factors were there in many of the matches last season and the promotion is certain to have added extra motivation to an already motivated the first team. Last season someone used the term 'Fortress Hutt Park', and optimistically, realistically even something in me says 'same again'.
