

We have been fortunate to welcome in some new additions to the First Team squad, as well as some familiar faces. Regular appearances for youngsters like Niko Sarich and Ethan Bingham have been well deserved, as well as Reserve Team players such as Lachie Bruce, Shikane Tuhoro, Dylan Edwards, Cole Krech-Watene and Harry Bloomfield. We are really pleased with the depth we have at the club, which will be so important for us this year.

Chris Campbell is returning in his valuable role as Goalkeeper Coach. Cambo is an immensely popular figure within the group and I am stoked to have him back. Paul Commerford once again returns as First Team Manager, tasked with catering to the needs of the players and keeping me grounded when I get over excited. Capital 1 winning coach Jake Ward has joined our staff as my assistant, providing a different set of eyes that has thus far proved to be extremely valuable.





Following on from Jake's decision to step away from full time coaching, Camilo Ardiles has joined the club as the new Reserve Team Head Coach. Camilo has fitted in well with the players and staff and we are delighted to have him onboard. Javed Koya has also joined the club as the new Third Team Coach, a vital appointment as the boys find themselves in Capital 3 for the first time.

Our pre-season campaign has been a bit of a mixed bag, with several Covid related disruptions affecting our ability to roll out a regular eleven. On the plus side, this has meant we are giving plenty of opportunities to our players, and they have responded admirably. We notched wins over Central League opposition in Western Suburbs and North Wellington, as well as today's opponents Seatoun. Defeats against Wharfies and Lower Hutt gave us plenty to think about and work on. We are in a position now where we are happy with our work so far, but know the real work is just beginning.

We are under no illusions; this year is going to be tough. Capital Premier is a difficult league to break out of, with so many teams vying for promotion to the Central League, and the opportunity for National League football. I feel that we are better for the experience of 2021, and it will serve us well as we seek to return to the top tier of football.

A warm welcome to Seatoun A.F.C, it's great to see a club with such rich history back in the top tier of Wellington football. A special welcome back to Martin Packer, who will line up for the opposition today, having spent many years at Hutt Park.

A final thank you to the Committee for the work they do behind the scenes. The fact the club has continued to sail smoothly through the choppy waters of a global pandemic is a testament to the dedicated team that we are fortunate to have at the club.

We recently marked the untimely passing of Stop Out legend, Brent Hamlin.


A man of immense compassion, humility and a deep care for others, Brent will be greatly missed.


