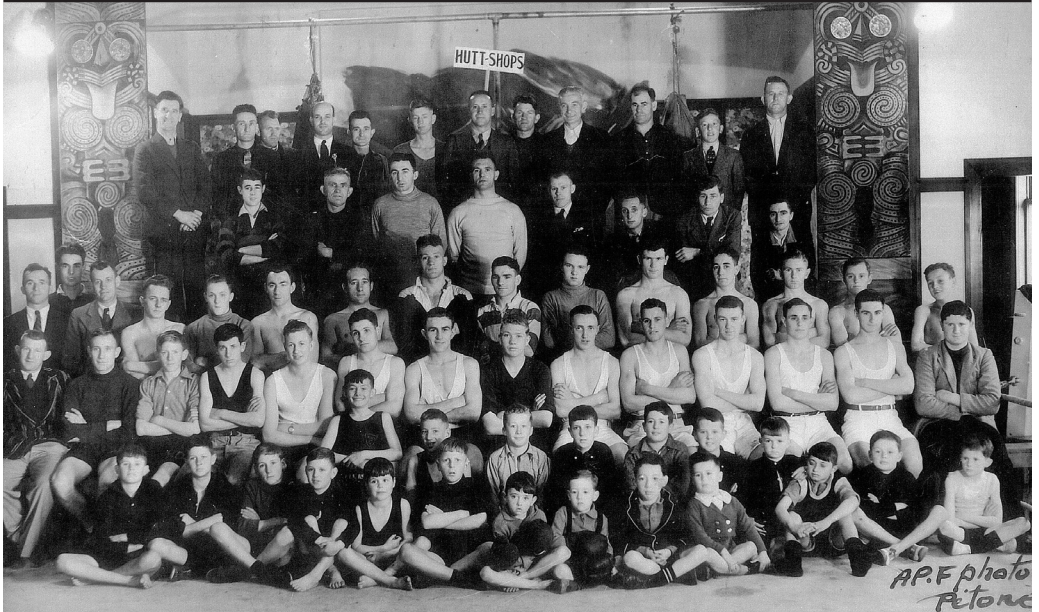

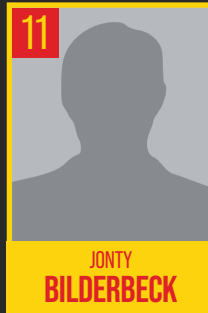

This signals a shift in thinking from the club from being only mixed, to having a specific girls pathway for the female player. Going up the age groups, we are glad that we have been awarded a TDP Licence once again.
