

ROUND 3 VS WAINUIOMATA

OUR FIRST LOCAL DERBY OF THE SEASON SAW US WELCOME WAINUI OVER THE HILL TO A BEAUTIFUL HUTT PARK DAY.

COVID continued to give us problems - Jared Cunniff had tested positive early in the week, as had Joe White. This meant a return to the lineup for Sam Wright, and a first start of the season for Sam Gillespie.

A dominant start to the game unfortunately failed to yield any openings. Two golden chances to score hit the bar and went just wide of the post, as we moved the ball reasonably well on a bumpy surface. Improvements to our play out were evident, a pleasing aspect given it has been a key area of focus over the past few weeks.

The visitors opened the scoring after a poor foul was given away in a dangerous area. We failed to deal with the delivery, which resulted in us conceding a scrappy goal.

The second half was a similar story. We continued to create some good chances, but let ourselves down with poor decision making in the final third. To their credit, Wainui defended deep and countered with good effect; this resulted in a second goal against the run of play. We continued to chase the game, but it wasn't to be.

All in all, a very frustrating afternoon. Lapses in concentration and an inability to handle our opponent's direct approach, combined with our wastefulness in front of goal, meant we could have few complaints.

ROUND 4 VS UPPER HUTT CITY

After a strong response in training during the week, we were looking to bounce back from last week's poor performance with an away trip to Upper Hutt on Good Friday.

During the week, COVID once again reared its ugly head, with Sam Wright testing positive. Joe was continuing to struggle with the effects of long COVID, so it meant an appearance in goal for Chris Campbell. While we were extremely fortunate to call upon the services of Cambo, it did highlight a clear gap in the governing bodies' regulations surrounding COVID. In their current form, COVID regulations stipulate that only two current positive cases for goalkeepers in a squad were grounds for a postponement. While there is emerging evidence that the effects of long COVID are very real and very serious, there are no avenues for clubs to manage our player's welfare safely.

We started the game strongly, moving the ball well and effectively pressing our opponents. A few good chances went begging, as our intensity started to pay dividends. We were forced into yet another goalkeeping change 30 minutes into the game, as Cambo went down with a torn hamstring. With no other option, we put our faith in



centre back Sam Cosgrave to step up.

This was a make or break moment for us. Faced with the adversity of having an outfielder in goal, we stepped it up another level. Our hard work was rewarded when Cunniff lashed home a loose ball from a corner - his first on his return to the club. Minutes later, a Jerram flick on resulted in Jack Morrissey scoring our second off a deft lob over the keeper. 2-0.

The second half was much the same. We harassed, fought and battled against a tiring opposition. Niko Sarich was enjoying a fine starting debut for the First Team, running the game in midfield alongside Lucas Jelley and Sam Gillespie. We put the game to bed in the 70th minute when Jack got his second of the game, tapping in a rebound from Cunniff's saved shot. 3-0, job done, response delivered.

This was a good day out. A relentless, passionate approach to the game paid dividends - not even an outfielder in goal could deter us. A sound defensive display laid the foundation for a strong performance. The challenge now is to better this performance. There is still a lot to come from these lads!


