

A POTENTIAL BANANA SKIN AWAITED US AS WE RETURNED TO HUTT PARK FOR THE FIRST TIME IN ALMOST A MONTH. THE GREEKS BROUGHT AN EXPERIENCED SIDE OUT TO THE HUTT WITH SEVERAL FIRST TEAM PLAYERS INVOLVED, WHICH ENSURED A TOUGH ENCOUNTER WAS IN STORE FOR US.

We were forced into a few changes; Sutty and Cunniff were still visiting family back home, while Jonty is missing a fair chunk of the season finding himself in the European summer. Gunny was ruled out with sickness, and Terran was ruled out with a slight knock during the week. In came Brandon, Grizz and Gilly, with Jacko and Kells returning via the bench. There was also a first appearance on the bench for goalkeeper Sam Martin, who joined us during the week from Upper Hutt.

The wet weather and heavy pitch were a difficult challenge for both sides. We started well, moving the ball quickly and creating plenty of problems for the Greeks. Our good start was rewarded when another trademark corner from Jordy resulted in a goalmouth scramble; Cossie helped the ball towards goal where Grizz was waiting to bundle it home for the opener. We continued to move the ball well, creating several good chances that went begging.

The second half became a more even affair as the Greeks started to press for an equaliser. This resulted in a more open, end to end game. We were defending brilliantly, preventing the opposition from getting close to our goal. We extended our lead in the 70th minute with a swift counter attack, following good work from Jacko and Guls to lay it on a plate to Jerram, who duly did his thing. The Greeks threw everything at us, which we dealt with well, right up until the last minute, as they bundled the ball home from a deep cross. A disappointing goal to concede after such a strong defensive display. It was ultimately not enough as we saw out the remaining minutes with ease.

Another resolute performance, one that could have been made easier with a bit more composure in front of goal. At this stage of the season, it is important to keep grinding out results as we remain three points clear at the top of the table.

Our next game in the hunt for promotion saw us make the long trip out to Seatoun Park. Sutty and Cunniff had returned from their trips home and returned to the starting lineup, in an otherwise unchanged starting eleven from the week before.

It was a beautiful day, with little wind to speak of and the sun shining brightly. As has become customary, we started the game strongly and put our opponents under pressure. We took the lead in the 22nd minute, Jerram finishing smartly on the edge of the box. We extended our lead minutes later when a looping cross from Jacko eluded the Seatoun keeper at his far post. We were playing well, dealing with the threat of Seatoun's counter attack well. Disappointingly, a lapse in concentration saw Seatoun grab one back, and we went into the sheds 2-1 ahead.

The second half proved to be a difficult task. We didn't start the half well, ceding possession and territory. A questionable penalty decision saw the game evened up, before poor marking from a set piece saw Seatoun

deservedly take the lead. We rolled the dice with a change in formation, throwing Cossie on up front to great effect. We wrestled back control of the game, and our fightback was rewarded in the last minute of the game; Cunniff was taken out in front of goal, and Sutty dispatched the penalty to rescue a point.

A pleasing fightback at the death, but a game tinged with frustration. We had allowed our standards to drop with some avoidable goals conceded; but fair play to Seatoun for the way they approached the game, and they were well worth the point. The focus now turns to another weekend off, before we take on Upper Hutt City at home.

200 APPEARANCES!

"I first started playing football for Petone, but after two years there I felt it was time for a change. When I was looking for a new club, I had girls I played other sports with telling me to join Stop Out as that was where they played. So I showed up to my first training back in 2010 on my 17th birthday and with Brendan Marsh, Chris Canton, and Russell Burley leading the helm, I felt like I was in good hands. From there, I haven't looked back.

I've always enjoyed competing and being active, and I struggle with social norms more than a lot of girls my age so coming here and meeting many different people over the years, getting to know them, playing with them and even some becoming like a football family has been a privilege.

It's been a hard road to get to this milestone, it has taken many physical and mental challenges along the way but I am glad I'm here and to be the first woman at Stop Out to do so. Especially since around this time last year, I had to re-learn how to walk and run after a broken leg and several surgeries caused by a dangerous tackle in a game.

I am glad to be back! Despite all my troubles over the years, my tenacity (or sheer stubbornness) has always prevailed.

I love that within the women's squad we celebrate these milestones, especially from Brendan now that he isn't coaching anymore. I think it's good to keep this tradition alive as it is harder to keep women in sport, more so than men. As we get older, we physically peak earlier than men, some have kids to care for and bodies change, and some would rather spend their Sundays on family and friendships, housework, getting ready for work the next day, etc. All those come into play and sport tends to take a back seat for a lot of us, so if a female player hits a milestone it's a great achievement. I hope to see more ladies join me in the 200 club, as well as see the women's squad grow again."
