



U17S UPDATE

What an absolute pleasure it has been working with our Under 17 TDP group this season. We are 11 games into our season, with 3 remaining to play. We are top of the table, with two games in hand over our opposing teams. We cannot be surpassed on points and have a brilliant goal difference of +17. This may seem like a small feat, but has been a significant story to get to this place.

Rewind to 2016, the club were struggling to compete in the A grade, and had been relegated to the B division, prior to any mention of a TDP. Alistair Yates came to the helm of our youth programme and quickly established a fantastic social environment where players were motivated to work hard, learn, and have a whole lot of fun doing it. At the programme's peak there were 4 teams. This shows the hard work, and time Alistair and his staff put into creating the right space for youth to play football.

We then established the 1919 Programme to offer specific training to those players who wanted to take the level of their game up. And now, here we are.

Our current U17 TDP programme contains players who have been at the club since at least 2016 and if not longer, including captains Phil Fatialofa and Blake Eveleigh, Abdul Abdullahi, James Ferguson, Anupa Aluvihare, Christain

Durno, Jude Dawson, Elliot Porter-Wallis, and Baxter Cocakyne. Many other boys joined soon after, showing the programme was working to provide something in the Hutt Valley for young players wanting to progress.

This season in the CDL grade, we lost our first game to a very unfortunate error at Hutt Park to Western Suburbs, but since our first regular season game on 1 May, we have not lost, and only drawn once. This is a simply outstanding achievement from a set of young men who chose to pursue the goal of topping the competition back in April 2022.

The boys have been phenomenal in their application, and attitude towards games, and late night training at Fraser Turf. We have 3 games remaining in the league, the first of these being tomorrow (Sunday) against Upper Hutt.
